


Computer (CPU)- central processing unit-the brain of the computer. The CPU interprets and carries out program instructions.

Keyboard- The keys that operate the computer, very much like a type writer, with extra keys for special functions





Monitor- the part of a computer system that contains the computer screen, where information is displayed






Mouse- A small hand-held device that controls the position of the cursor on the computer screen.



Mouse Pad- the pad on which you move the mouse




Speakers-Devices that allow you to hear sound from the computer





Hardware- The physical parts of a computer system



Software- the instructions that tell the computer and computer networks what to do. Software is installed inside the computer.



Icon- a small picture or image representing a command (such as print), a file, or a program. When you click on an icon, you start a command, open a file, or launch a program.




Cursor- A small image on the screen indicating where you are pointing; the mouse controls the movements of the cursor.



Cursor (Continued)


The cursor can appear in different forms.






Browsersoftware, such as Google Chrome, used to find information on the web. The most visible part of a browser sits at the top of the computer screen, above the web page.
