Logging in to the System

- 1. Connect your terminal to the system.
- 2. Type your login name, and press "Enter"
- 3. Type your password and press "Enter"

Changing your password

- 1. Type passwd, and press "Enter"
- 2. Type your current password, and press "Enter"
- 3. Type a new password, and press "Enter"
- 4. Type the new password again, and press "Enter"

Logging Out of the System

- 1. Type ctrl- D, and wait for the login: prompt.
- 2. On some systems, you can type logout.
