Beginning and Ending an Editing Session

- 1. Type v1, followed by the name of the file to be edited, and press "Enter".
- 2. Press a to get into text entry mode.
- 3. Enter text.
- 4. Press "Esc" to leave 2text entry mode.
- 5. Type :w to write the text to the file.
- 6. Type :q to leave vi and return to the shell prompt.

Moving the Cursor

- Using any of the arrow keys to move cursor one space.
- Type . to repeat or undo keystrokes.
- Type ^ or \$ to move to the beginning or end of the current line, respectively.
- Type b or w to move backward or forward one word.
- Type (or) to move backward or forward one sentence.
- Type { or } to move backward or forward one paragraph.
- Type H, M or L to move to the high, middle, or low line of the screen.
- Type nG to move the cursor to line n.

Entering Text

- Type i, a, or o to insert text before or append text after the cursor position, or open a new line before the current line to enter text.
- Type I, A, and O to insert text before or append text after the current line, or open a new line above the current line to enter tex=xt.
